Faculty recommendation with reference to some SLA Grant outcomes	Program meets minimum criteria and is evaluated as acceptable by relevant faculty  Program offers few opportunities for extracurricular language study or practice.  Program selection rationale demonstrates some awareness of program goals or criteria	Applicant demonstrates some investment in language study that will likely continue after study abroad  Applicant demonstrates some awareness of available opportunities for local community engagement and/or service alongside some intent to pursue them	Anticipated costs are slightly high in comparison to other SLA Grant programs and funding thresholds  Funding request demonstrates a lack of modest spending and minimal or no personal financial investment in program costs  Funding rationale demonstrates some need for funding in order to pursue language study abroad	Overall, the proposal is minimally acceptable with some application to the goals of the SLA Grant Program.
